Quick Installation

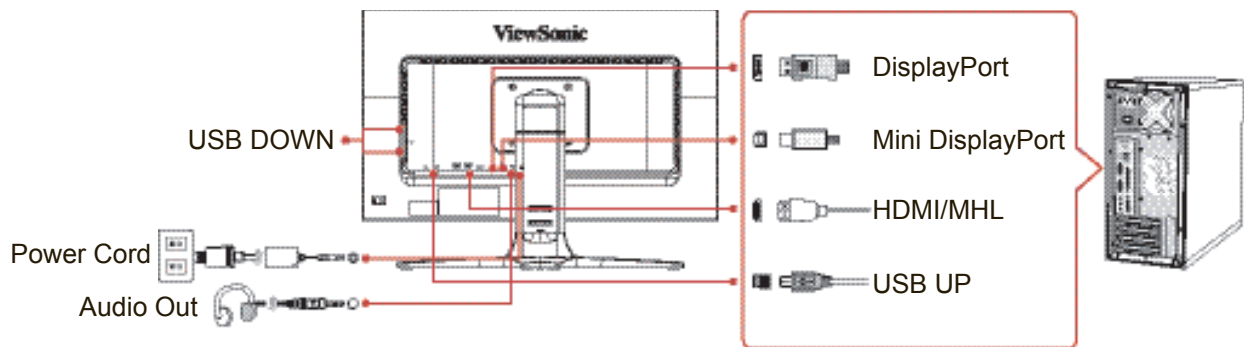
1. Connect video cable

- Make sure both the display and computer are turned OFF.
- Remove rear panel covers if necessary.
- Connect the video cable from the display to the computer.

Macintosh users: Models older than G3 require a Macintosh adapter. Attach the adapter to the computer and plug the video cable into the adapter.

To order a ViewSonic® Macintosh adapter, contact ViewSonic Customer Support.

2. Connect power cord (and AC/DC adapter if required)



3. Turn ON the display and computer

Turn ON the display, then turn ON the computer. This sequence (display before computer) is important.

NOTE: Windows users may receive a message asking them to install the INF file. To access the file, please use the directory ":\CD\vsfiles".

4. Insert the ViewSonic CD into the computer's CD drive.

If your computer does not have a CD-ROM drive, please refer to Customer Support page.

5. Windows users: Set the timing mode (example: 1024 x 768)

For instructions on changing the resolution and refresh rate, see the graphics card's user guide.

6. Installation is complete. Enjoy your new ViewSonic display.

Additional Software Installation (Optional)

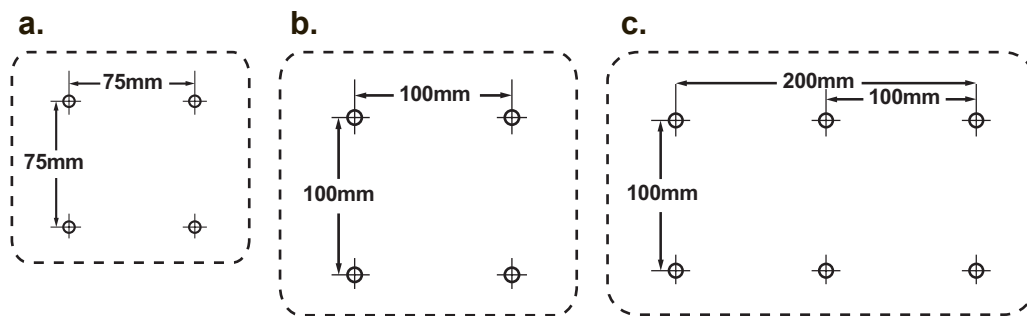
1. Load the ViewSonic CD on your CD/DVD drive.
2. Double click on the "Software" folder and choose an application, if desired.
3. Double click on the Setup.exe file and follow the onscreen instructions to complete the simple installation.

Wall Mounting (Optional)

NOTE: For use only with UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket.

To obtain a wall-mounting kit or height adjustment base, contact ViewSonic® or your local dealer. Refer to the instructions that come with the base mounting kit. To convert your display from a desk-mounted to a wall-mounted display, do the following:

1. Verify that the power button is turned Off, then disconnect the power cord.
2. Lay the display face down on a towel or blanket.
3. Remove the base. (Screws removal might be required.)
4. Find and identify one of the following VESA mount interfaces (a,b,c) located on the back of your display (refer to “Specifications” page for your displays mounting interface). Attach the mounting bracket from the VESA compatible wall mounting kit using screws of the appropriate length.



5. Attach the display to the wall, following the instructions in the wall-mounting kit.

Using the Display

Setting the Timing Mode

Setting the timing mode is important for maximizing the quality of the screen image and minimizing eye strain. The timing mode consists of the resolution (example 1024 x 768) and refresh rate (or vertical frequency; example 60 Hz). After setting the timing mode, use the OSD (On-screen Display) controls to adjust the screen image. For optimal picture quality, please use the recommended timing mode specific to your display listed on the "Specification" page.

To set the Timing Mode:

- **Setting the resolution:** Access "Appearance and Personalization" from Control Panel via the Start Menu, and set the resolution.
- **Setting the refresh rate:** See your graphic card's user guide for instructions.


IMPORTANT: Please make sure that your graphics card is set to 60Hz vertical refresh rate as the recommended setting for most displays. Choosing a non-supported timing mode setting may result in no image being displayed, and a message showing "Out of Range" will appear on screen.

OSD and Power Lock Settings

- **OSD Lock:** Press and hold [1] and the up arrow ▲ for 10 seconds. If any buttons are pressed the message **OSD Locked** will display for 3 seconds.
- **OSD Unlock:** Press and hold [1] and the up arrow ▲ again for 10 seconds.
- **Power Button Lock:** Press and hold [1] and the down arrow ▼ for 10 seconds. If the power button is pressed the message **Power Button Locked** will display for 3 seconds. With or without this setting, after a power failure, your display's power will automatically turn ON when power is restored.
- **Power Button Unlock:** Press and hold [1] and the down arrow ▼ again for 10 seconds.

Adjusting the Screen Image

Use the buttons on the front control panel to display and adjust the OSD controls which display on the screen.

Do the following to adjust the display setting:

1. To display the Main Menu, press button [1].

NOTE: All OSD menus and adjustment screens disappear automatically after about 15 seconds. This is adjustable through the OSD timeout setting in the setup menu.

2. To select a control to adjust, press ▲ or ▼ to scroll up or down in the Main Menu.
3. After the desired control is selected, press button [2].
4. To save the adjustments and exit the menu, press button [1] until OSD disappear.

The following tips may help you optimize your display:

- Adjust the computer's graphics card to support a recommended timing mode (refer to "Specifications" page for recommended setting specific to your display). To find instructions on "changing the refresh rate", please refer to the graphics card's user guide.
- If necessary, make small adjustments using H. POSITION and V. POSITION until the screen image is completely visible. (The black border around the edge of the screen should barely touch the illuminated "active area" of the display.)

Main Menu Controls

Adjust the menu items by using the up ▲ and down ▼ buttons.

NOTE: Check the Main Menu items on your display OSD and refer to Main Menu Explanation below.

Main Menu Explanation

NOTE: The Main Menu items listed in this section indicates whole Main Menu items of all models. For the actual Main Menu details corresponding to your product refer to the items on your display's OSD Main Menu.

B Brightness

adjusts background black level of the screen image.

C Color Adjust

provides several color adjustment modes, including preset color temperatures and a User Color mode which allows independent adjustment of GAIN, OFFSET, SATURATION and HUE. The factory setting for this product is native.

There are five selections: sRGB, EBU, BLUISH, COOL, NATIVE, WARM and USER COLOR.

GAIN: Adjust white temperature to customize your USER COLOR (can be saved in User Mode) or a specific color temperature and gain value (red, green, blue) use this setting.

OFFSET: Adjusts black levels for red, green and blue.
The gain and offset functions allow users to control the white balance for the upmost control when manipulating contrast and dark scenes.

6-axis Color Adjustment Function

SATURATION: Adjusts the color depth of each color (red, green, blue, cyan, magenta and yellow)

HUE: Adjusts the hue of each color (red, green, blue, cyan, magenta and yellow).

To deliver precise and accurate color performance, the independent 6-axis color adjustment function (red, green, blue, cyan, magenta and yellow) allows users to customize hue and saturation for each color axis individually, without affecting the other color outputs.

Contrast

adjusts the difference between the image background (black level) and the foreground (white level).

I Information

displays the timing mode (video signal input) coming from the graphics card in the computer, the display model number, the serial number, and the ViewSonic® website URL. See your graphics card's user guide for instructions on changing the resolution and refresh rate (vertical frequency).

NOTE: VESA 1024 x 768 @ 60Hz (example) means that the resolution is 1024 x 768 and the refresh rate is 60 Hertz.

Input Select

toggles between inputs if you have more than one computer connected to the display.

M Manual Image Adjust

displays the Manual Image Adjust menu. You can manually set a variety of image quality adjustments.

MULTI-PICTURE

Select MULTI-PICTURE MODE: QUAD WINDOW, PBP TOP-BOTTOM, PBP LEFT-RIGHT, PIP.

1. Default = Off
 - = On
 - = Off
2. QUAD WINDOWS: You can select four picture split screen type.
3. PBP TOP-BOTTOM: You can select two picture split screen type, and showing two picture side-by-sides on the top and bottom.
4. PBP LEFT-RIGHT: You can select 2 picture split screen type, and showing 2 picture side-by-side on the left and right.
5. PIP: Two picture split screen type, showing large and the small picture on the screen.
6. PIP SIZE: Control the size of sub-picture used in PIP.
7. PIP POSITION: Control the position of sub-picture used in PIP mode.
8. PIP SWAP: Swap main-picture source and sub-picture source.
9. SOURCE SELECT: Select source of the MULTI-PICTURE use in the QUAD WINDOW, PBP TOP-BOTTOM, PBP LEFT-RIGHT and PIP.

GAMMA: Allows users to manually adjust the brightness level of the monitor's grayscale levels. There are five selections: 1.8, 2.0, 2.2, 2.4, and 2.6.

UNIFORMINTY: The VX2780-4K's Uniformity Correction function compensates any luminance and color uniformity imbalance on the screen, such as dark spots, uneven brightness, or illegible images on the screen. With the ViewSonic uniformity correction function, grayscale levels are balanced, and delta E scores are improved to be ≤ 2 . Color reproduction, accuracy, and delta E numbers will all be improved, increasing reliability and offering the highest quality viewing experience from every monitor.

NOTE: If the uniformity function is enabled, it will reduce the overall peak luminance of the display.

Memory Recall

returns the adjustments back to factory settings if the display is operating in a factory Preset Timing Mode listed in the Specifications of this manual.

Exception: This control does not affect changes made with the Language Select or Power Lock setting.

S Setup Menu

adjusts On-screen Display (OSD) settings.

SAVE AS

The OSD save function (include Input source). There are 3 main positions (USER MODE 1, USER MODE 2, USER MODE3), which allows users to save their OSD settings.

DISPLAYPORT V1.2 : Switch v1.2 and v1.1 for DISPLAYPORT Version

= DISPLAYPORT V1.2 mode

= DISPLAYPORT V1.1 mode

NOTE: If you want to enable 4k 60 Hz with Apple devices or PC when connected via DP, firstly your device(PC, Apple device, NB) must be have a DP1.2 port and support 4k 60 Hz. Secondly, DP 1.2 should be enabled via the OSD.

Do the following to adjust the display setting

1. Multi-Picture

Step 1: press the '1' on your ViewSonic Monitor bezel, to open the OSD (on screen display)

Step 2: Use the arrows to select the 'Manual Image Adjust' feature

Step 3: Use the arrow (buttons) to select the 'Multi-Picture' feature

2-1. PIP Position

Choose one to adjust the smaller screen's position:

PIP H. Position adjusts the horizontal position of the smaller screen on a range from 0-100, with 0 starting from the left position of the screen and 100 starting from the right position of the screen.

PIP V. Position adjusts the vertical position of the smaller screen on a range from 0-100, with 0 starting from the bottom side of the screen and 100 starting from the top side of the screen.

2-2. PIP Size

You can adjust the size of the smaller window by pressing the up and down arrows, with a range of 0-100

2-3. PIP Swap

Press PIP Swap to change the image source of the smaller screen with the larger screen when the PIP function is selected

To deactivate any "multi-picture" mode, simply go to the "multi-picture" option and select the same mode again to reset your monitor back to normal.

Power Management

This product will enter to Sleep/Off mode with black screen and reduced power consumption within 3 seconds of no signal input.

Cleaning the Display

- MAKE SURE THE DISPLAY IS TURNED OFF.
- NEVER SPRAY OR POUR ANY LIQUID DIRECTLY ONTO THE SCREEN OR CASE.

To clean the screen:
